POSITION RESPONSIBILITIES

- Performing engine room watch during tug operation.
- Securing of equipment for transport or docking.
- Assisting Tug Captain in landing equipment using radio and/or hand signals.
- Standing watch as a lookout while underway and reporting hazards to Tug Captain.
- Performing general maintenance duties such as painting, sweeping and mopping.
- Performing general housekeeping and maintenance of equipment, machinery, and jobsite.
- Maintaining barges or scows used on project.
- Loading and unloading of supplies/equipment.
- Inspection of all equipment and rigging.
- Cooking meals for assigned vessel.
- Assisting in setup and breakdown of tow.
- Assisting in setup and breakdown of project.

QUALIFICATIONS AND SKILLS

- 2+ years deckhand experience preferred.
- Merchant Mariner Credential (MMC).
- Transportation Workers Identification Credential (TWIC).
- Welding Certification is beneficial (required for Seniority).
- Willingness to work up to 12-hour shifts, day or night, 7 days a week throughout the Great Lakes.
- Must be able to lift up to 50 lbs.
- Required to work in adverse weather conditions.
- Must have basic knowledge of machinery in order to assist in servicing or repairing of the vessel.
- Commitment to work safely and follow all safety policies and procedures.
- Computer skills.
- Complete a pre-employment physical examination and drug screen.
