POSITION RESPONSIBILITIES

- Safely operate towing vessels of less than 100 gross register tons (GRT).
- Steering boats/barges into and out of berths and harbors.
- Towing up to three pieces of marine equipment from port to port.
- Using specialized knowledge of local winds, weather, water depth and currents.
- Consulting maps, publications, charts, weather reports and navigation equipment/software to determine and direct all equipment movement on the jobsite.
- Completing and recording in "Helm" software all required inspections, tests, drills and training.
- Maintaining all required logs.
- Assisting on required maintenance and repairs on tug.
- Supervising all crew members including directing work, training, appraising, disciplining and resolving issues.
- Assisting construction crew out of the tug on an as-needed basis.

QUALIFICATIONS AND SKILLS

- Master of Towing Vessels Upon the Great Lakes.
- 5+ years marine experience with at least 2 years experience as a Captain.
- Radar Observer Endorsement.
- Transportation Workers Identification Credential (TWIC)
- Welding Certification - beneficial but not required.
- Willingness to work up to 12-hour shifts, day or night, 7 days a week throughout the Great Lakes.
- Must have basic knowledge of machinery in order to assist in servicing or repairing of the vessel.
- Commitment to work safely and follow all safety policies and procedures.
- Knowledge and understanding of Subchapter M regulations and requirements.
- Computer skills
- Complete pre-employment physical examination and drug screen.
